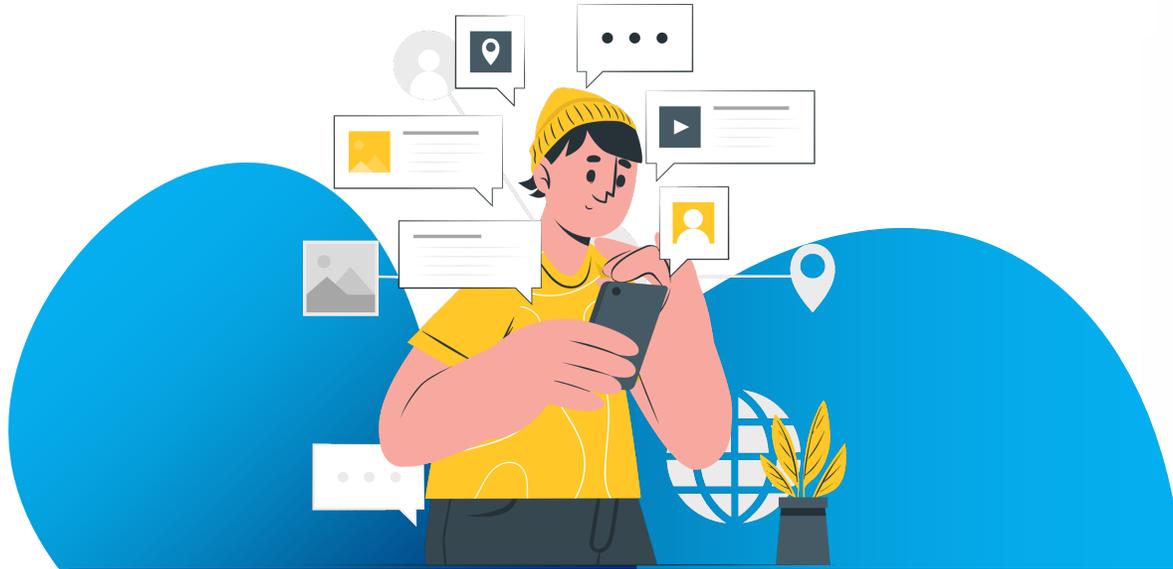

## Why This Matters

### The Police Executive Research Forum (2017) asserts that

9-1-1 is the most significant social contract between local governments and its citizens in the history of the United States. Countless lives have been saved, criminal offenders apprehended, crimes solved, and crimes prevented because of the availability and reliability of 9-1-1 (p. 16).

With **high turnover rates**, understaffed 9-1-1 centers mean people cannot effectively access police, fire, or emergency medical service assistance when they need it.

**They are leaving for (generally) correctable reasons!**

# Challenges in the ECC

## High-Stress Environment + Emotional Toll + Erratic Work Hours + Isolation

However, purpose provides a sense of meaning and direction, which can help dispatchers cope with stress. It allows them to see the bigger picture and understand the importance of their role in helping save lives.

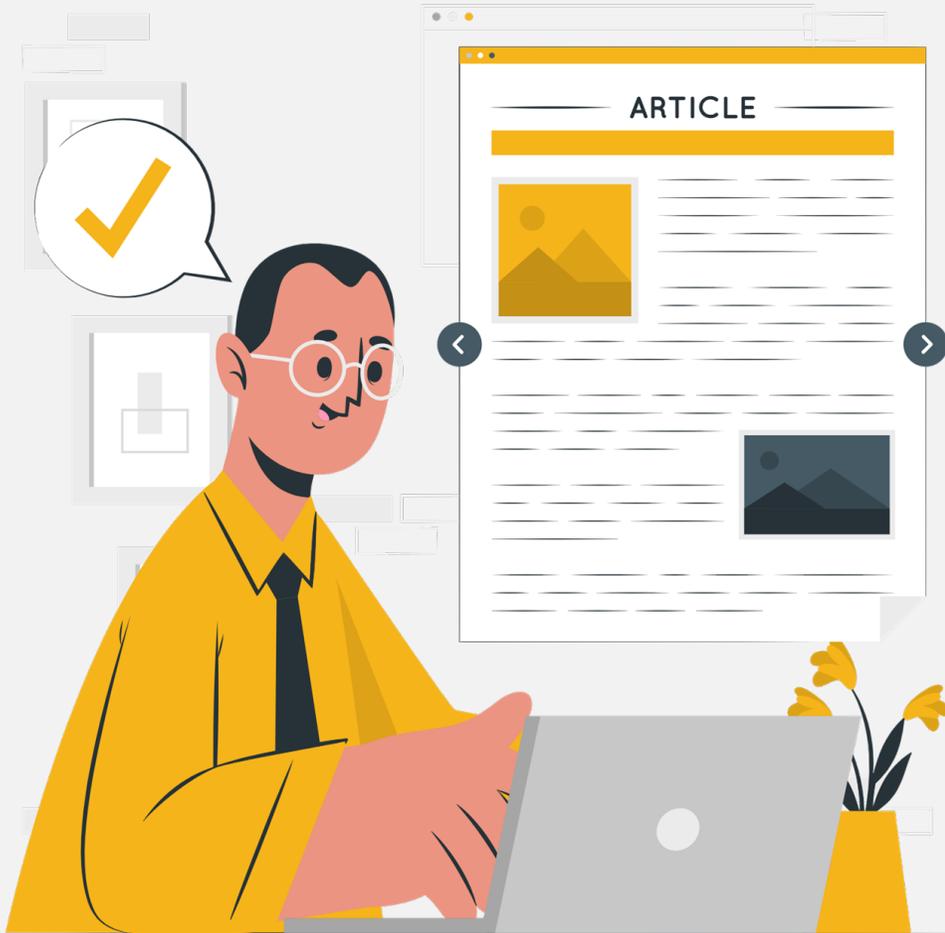




# Positive Culture

In 9-1-1 emergency dispatch, fostering a positive culture is crucial for enhancing employee well-being, engagement, and performance. It connects employees with the organization's mission, fueling their dedication to delivering top-notch emergency services.

How can purpose boost teamwork and resilience, benefiting employee well-being and effectiveness?



# Importance of a Positive Culture

Research by Imperative and LinkedIn shows that 73% of employees who report a sense of purpose at work are engaged, compared to only 23% of those who don't.

A positive culture is crucial in an ECC as it fosters a sense of meaning, mission, and passion among employees, resulting in improved performance, teamwork, and overall effectiveness in saving lives and serving the community.



## The Significance of Purpose

Purpose in the workplace refers to a profound sense of meaning, a reason for being, and a connection to a larger mission or cause. It's not just about the tasks we perform, but why we do them and how they contribute to a greater good.

- ▶ PURPOSE is more than a buzzword; it's a powerful force that can transform organizations. It's about values, ethics, and a shared commitment to a mission that transcends daily challenges.

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# Culture & Change: The Roadmap to Thriving

# "Mod Squad"



- Culture Impact (OCAI): **Hierarchical** – Order-driven, structured, rule-based
- **Pressures: Psychological** – Fighting personal battles as a young dispatcher while dealing with inadequate leadership
- Leadership Style (MLQ): **Transactional** – Focused on control, consistency, and meeting expectations
- Impact on Performance: Focused more on **technical excellence** than emotional intelligence and team cohesion



# EMS + Grady

## General Jones

- Culture Impact (OCAI): **Market** – Performance-focused, competitive, results-driven
- **Pressures: Social** – New dispatch center with a tense dynamic between communications staff and field operations
- Leadership Style (MLQ): **Directive** – Authority-driven, enforcing policies, high expectations
- Impact on Performance: Created efficiency but **fueled hostility** instead of fostering collaboration



# Huge Internal Shift

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- Culture Impact (OCAI): **Clan/Collaborative** – Relationship-based, engagement-focused
- **Pressures: Physical** – Room temperature, long hours at the console, broken chairs, and even working shifts due to staffing shortages and contract/acquisition
- Leadership Style (MLQ): **Transformational** (emerging) – Influencing change, strategic leadership
- Impact on Performance: **Gained awareness** of how working conditions directly affect dispatcher well-being and efficiency



# The Turning Point

- Culture Impact (OCAI): **Adhocracy** – Innovation-driven, adaptable, proactive
- **Pressures: Organizational** – Driving transformation while implementing Balanced Scorecard to improve effectiveness with new CAD and ensure business sustainability
- Leadership Style (MLQ): **Fully Transformational** – Coaching, mentoring, influencing beyond operations
- Impact on Performance: Learned how **strategic leadership** can determine the survival of an organization



# Scaling Awareness

- Culture Impact (OCAI): **Balancing Clan** (people-first) with Hierarchy (structured processes) in a multicultural environment
- **Pressures: Social & Organizational** – Managing a frontline workforce of **1,761 staff from 25 countries** while maintaining alignment with a mission to deliver the safest, most effective, and compassionate care under structured policy and SOPs
- Leadership Style (MLQ): **Transformational & Servant Leadership** – Focusing on mentorship, collaboration, and empowerment
- Impact on Performance: **Strengthened mentorship and collaboration** as key leadership principles

# Recognition and Rewards

**Recognition reinforces the importance of purpose-driven work. Establish recognition programs that acknowledge employees who exemplify the organization's mission and values.**

Recognition and rewards play a crucial role in promoting a purpose-driven culture by acknowledging and incentivizing employees who align with the organization's mission and values, creating a sense of belonging, motivation, and pride.







# Wellness and Support Programs

— If leaders don't promote well-being, organizations will never be as strong or productive as they could be.

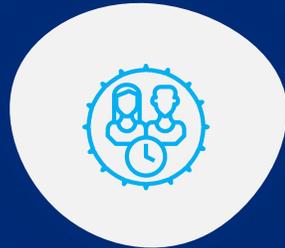
Develop wellness programs that support employees' mental and emotional well-being, which can enhance their sense of purpose.

Offer mental health resources, such as counseling or stress management workshops as well as establish peer support programs, to help dispatchers cope with the emotional toll of their work.

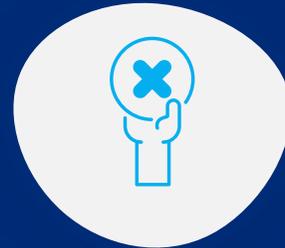
# 80 / 20 Rule

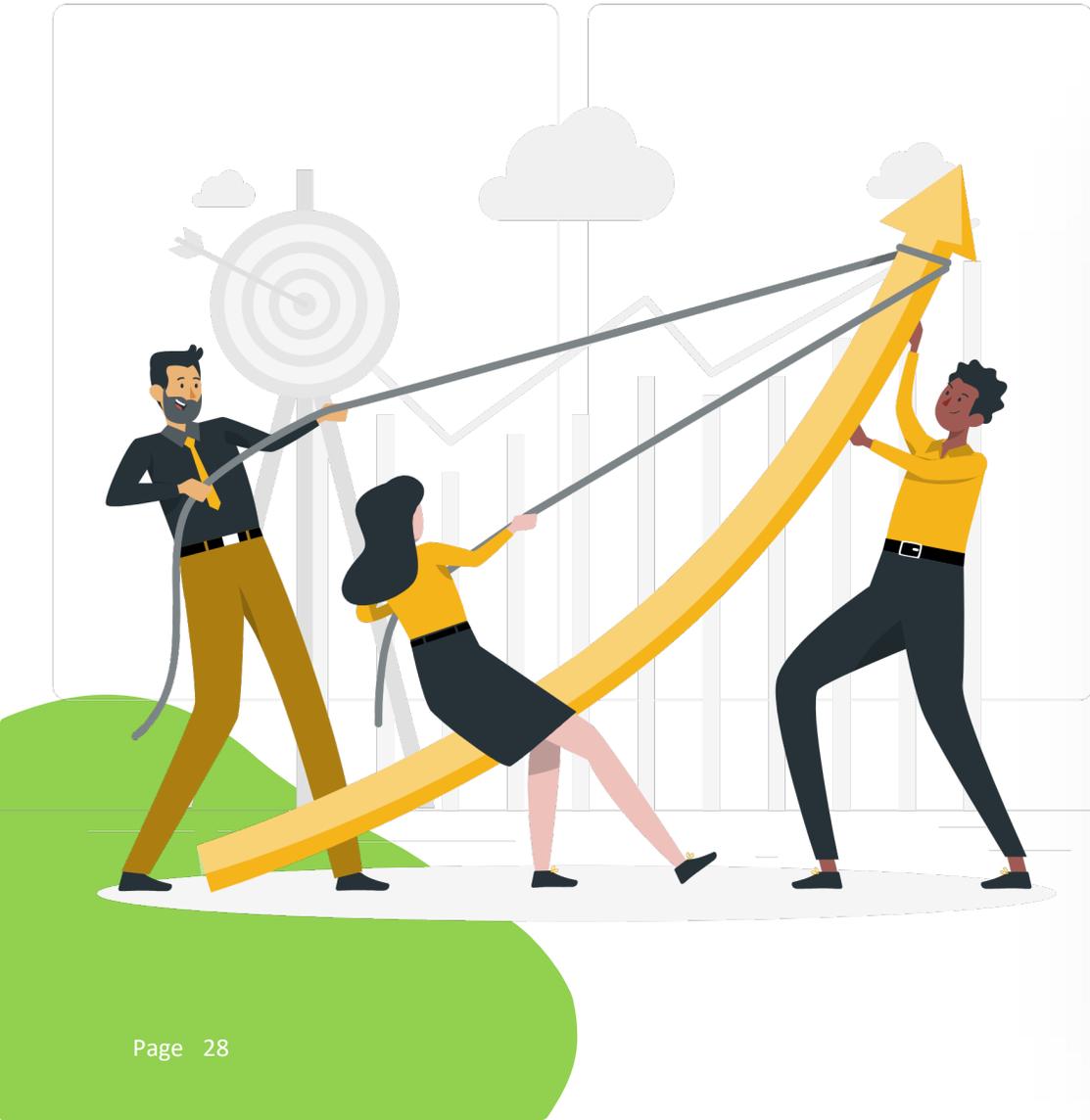

**Leaders play a pivotal role in setting the tone for the organization. They serve as role models, demonstrating how to embody the organization's mission and values.**

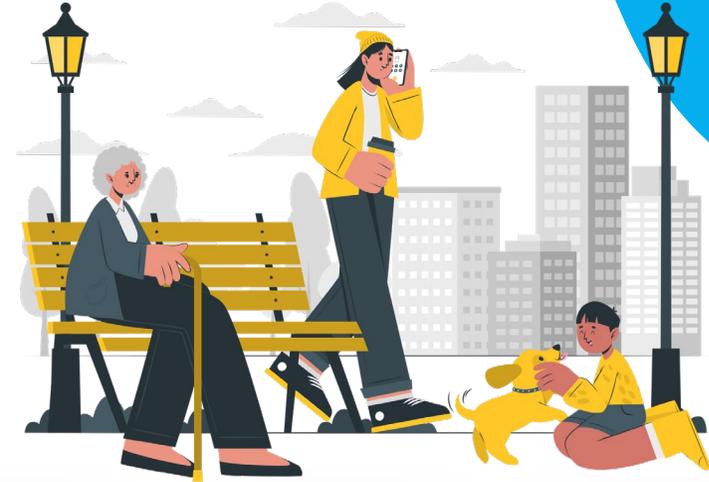
**Burnout doesn't happen because of workload. It happens because of poor leadership.**

# Improving Emotional Intelligence

## Self-Awareness

Encourage self-reflection to develop an understanding of one's own emotions, triggers, and reactions. This self-awareness is the foundation of emotional intelligence.

## Empathy

Foster empathy by promoting active listening and encouraging employees to consider others' perspectives. This helps build stronger connections within workplace.

## Respectful Interactions

Improving emotional intelligence leads to more respectful and considerate interactions among employees. They learn to communicate with empathy and tact.

## Positive Work Environment

When emotional intelligence is a focus, the workplace becomes a more positive and inclusive environment where all employees feel valued and heard.

## Collaboration and Teamwork

Enhanced emotional intelligence fosters better teamwork and collaboration. Employees work cohesively toward a shared purpose.

## Emotional Intelligence Workshops

Offer and training sessions on emotional intelligence, focusiwoonrkshopsng self- awareness, empathy, self-regulation, and social skills.





# Resilience

Resilience is the ability to bounce back and thrive in the face of adversity. Resilience is not the absence of challenges or adversity. It is not about avoiding difficult situations, but rather, resilience is the ability to navigate and overcome challenges, learn from setbacks, and adapt positively in the face of adversity.

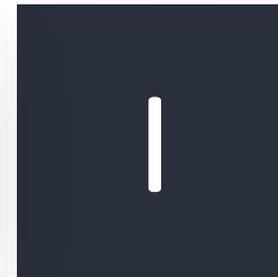

If you want a resilient, high-performing organization, start by creating a space where people can speak the truth without fear of consequences.
